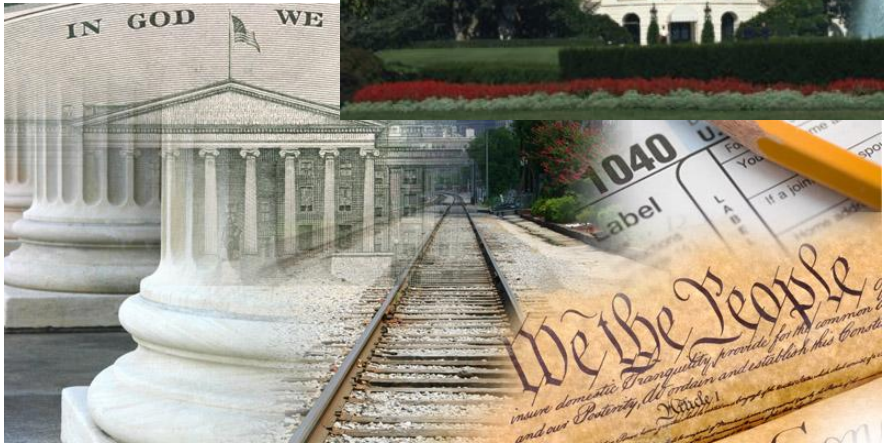
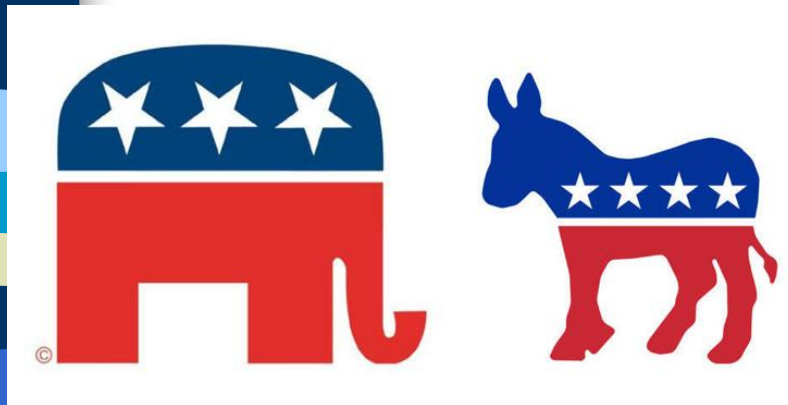

Type of Government	Who has the power?	How is power obtained?	Terms to help you understand
Democracy		Through open and free elections	<b>Republic</b> - the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who are entitled to vote for officers and representatives responsible to them
Dictatorship	Individual or small group of people		<b>Oligarchy</b> -type of government that is run by a small circle of elite individuals, typically the wealthy <b>Junta</b> - military government
Monarchy	Kings and Queens		<b>Divine Right</b> -right to rule had been given by God
Theocracy		Leader believes they have been given a revelation.	<b>Sacred</b> -refers to things relating to religion, or to the services of religion <b>Secular</b> -is the term used to describe all of the things in life that are not religious
