



#### Take action for Saeed Hatim, still detained in Guantanamo after judicial order for release



Saeed Mohammed Saleh Hatim remains detained in Guanánamo without charge or trial after eight years, despite the fact that a US federal judge ordered his release in 2009. The Obama administration has appealed the judge's ruling. Urge the administration to drop the appeal, and to immediately release Saeed Hatim.

#### Microsoft: Don't Be a Partner of Censorship



Amnesty International is concerned about the ways Microsoft may be aiding the repression of freedom to information and expression in China. According to recent reports, Microsoft's search engine blocks searches under key words such as "freedom", "democracy", "human rights", "Falun Gong", and

"demonstration", among others. Users of Microsoft Spaces are also prohibited from using these and other words on the weblogs they create.

#### Help Prevent the Execution of a Juvenile in Saudi Arabia



Domestic worker Rizana Nafeek was sentenced to death in Saudi Arabia for a murder committed when she was just 17 years old. Saudi Arabia is a state party to the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), which expressly prohibits the execution of offenders for crimes committed when they were

under 18 years old. The case has been sent to the King for ratification of the death sentence; if the King does ratify the death sentence, Rizana Nafeek will be at imminent risk of execution by beheading.





ESSAY QUESTION: "In the lesson, you were challenged to find some action related to human rights that you could do in order to help. In a **well-developed paragraph**, describe your choice of actions and how you could go about accomplishing it, how it relate to human rights, and explain why you selected it

Notice there are FOUR PARTS in this question to answer. Let's break it down:

- 1. Describe your choice of actions
- 2. How you could go about accomplishing it
- 3. How it relates to human rights
- 4. Explain why you selected it



A great submission would answer the basic questions of:

Who? What? When? Where? Why?



A NON-example might look like this:

i picked free speech. Everyone needs 2 go to be able to say waht they want. I can help by telling everybody i know that free speech is a human right

What's wrong with this answer??

Let's compare it to the rubric....

#### It's a NON-example because:

It doesn't explain how the topic or action is related to human rights issues.

It doesn't explain how the student would implement the action.

It doesn't have any in-depth discussion as to why the action was picked.

It's not a well-developed paragraph.

The submission was not proofread for grammar.

Based on this analysis of the non-example, what score would you give it?
